APPROVED MINUTES OF BOARD OF EDUCATION MEETING

January 20, 2016

1. Call to Order

President Alisa MacAvoy called the meeting to order at 7:01 p.m. at the District Office, Redwood City School District ("RCSD"), 750 Bradford Street, Redwood City.

Present at the Board Meeting: President Alisa MacAvoy, Hilary Paulson, María Díaz-Slocum, Dennis McBride, Janet Lawson and Superintendent John Baker.

Others present: Chief Business Official Wael Saleh, Executive Director of Educational Services PreK-5 Linda Montes, Executive Director of Educational Services 6-8 Wendy Kelly, Leslie Crane, Teri Montgomery, Blake Boehm, Mark Kelley.

2. Welcome

President MacAvoy welcomed those present. The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

3. Changes to the Agenda

President MacAvoy requested to move Consent Items 8.7 and 8.8 to Action. Additionally, President MacAvoy requested to move the Recognition of the Sequoia Healthcare District to the February 10th board meeting.

Blake Boehm provided the School Board and Superintendent Baker with an overview of the general obligation bonds, the implementation of a bond program, and a schedule of Measure T issuance.

7.2 Discussion on the Overview of the Construction Process, DWK

Mark Kelley from Dannis Woliver Kelley (DWK) provided the School Board and Superintendent Baker with a presentation detailing the planning phase, design phase, and construction phase for RCSD school sites utilizing Measure T funds.

7.3 Discussion on 6-8 Grade Programs at Fair Oaks School and Taft Community School

Superintendent Baker stated that he held meetings with parents at Fair Oaks School and Taft Community School to discuss his concerns about the progress of the 6th grade classrooms. Superintendent Baker commented that he had an extensive conversation with parents and the schools' principals and discussed the areas where these middle school programs need improvement.

Superintendent Baker expressed that he does not believe that having a sixth grade at Fair Oaks School and Taft Community School would be effective long-term. Superintendent Baker does not believe the students are obtaining the academic enrichment and support that would eventually prepare them for high school. Superintendent Baker commented that he would meet with Linda Montes and Wendy Kelly to discuss providing transportation to parents in order for them to visit Selby Lane School and Garfield School. Superintendent Baker added that he would provide a summer school program for the students currently enrolled in sixth grade at both school sites.

Superintendent Baker expressed that parents were receptive to the information he presented, as well as his concerns; however, there are a few parents who would like to keep 6th grade at Fair Oaks School.

All board members agreed that all students should receive the academic support they deserve to prepare them and ensure their success in high school.

Superintendent Baker commented that he would provide further information to the School Board after he meets with Linda Montes and Wendy Kelly. Superintendent Baker reiterated that they would work arduously to provide the necessary support and resources to these students.
